Duties and Responsibilities

Production Planning

- 1. Works with Executive Director to set budgets for the productions compatible with parameters of the full organization's budget
- 2. Implements and monitors a production timeline for each 2024-2025 production. This includes but is not limited to:
 - a. Student rehearsal schedule
 - b. Production meetings
 - c. Volunteer schedules
- 3. Meet with the Executive Director and/or Board of Directors regarding all aspects of the productions
- 4. Meet with adult volunteers regarding props, costumes, sets, lights, hair, etc.
- 5. Works with VRCFA to fulfil any technical needs for the production
- 6. Becomes familiar with PACT's storage inventory to know what can be utilized for the season's productions

Production Implementation

- 1. Responsible for artistic design of productions, such as costumes, lighting, set, etc.
- 2. Oversees the creation of all elements of productions such as costumes, set, props, etc.
- 3. Responsible for casting student performers
- 4. Responsible for teaching all elements of performance to students including but not limited to:
 - a. Blocking
 - b. Choreography
 - c. Music (PACT has a dedicated Music Director, but the CT Director is still responsible for overseeing the teaching of production music)
 - d. Stage Management
 - e. Backstage Crew
 - f. Light Board
 - g. Spotlights
- 5. Executing a high artistic quality of show
- 6. Providing a safe and creative environment for all student particiapants
- 7. Responsible budgeting and use of resources
- 8. Works with Executive Director to ensure accurate expense reporting
- 9. Utilizes feedback for continuous improvement of the program

Student Performer Coordination

1. Parent/performer communication such as email, Facebook secret group, etc.
